The Oilfield Christian Fellowship began in May 1991 as an outlet for Christians in the oilfield to meet each other. The OCF has evolved into many more forms of outreach, including a Bible ministry, facilitating and supporting a truck and trailer field ministry and a man camp chapel in Wyoming. Oil workers have carried over 220,000 Bibles in 31 languages to 60 countries around the world. Of those, over 200,000 are custom Oil Patch Bibles written in English, Spanish, Chinese and Portuguese. The long-term goal is to reproduce this unique Bible, *God's Word for the Oil Patch, Fuel for the Soul* into every language in the world where there is an oil and gas presence.

The Oil Patch Chaplains consist of more than 60 volunteer chaplains who are either full-time or retired oil industry workers. Chaplains are required to have at least 32 hours of classroom training in critical incident response, the same training recognized by the Red Cross, FEMA and all NATO countries. These volunteers are from all Christian faiths, and they have been called to numerous critical incidents since the organization started in January 2008. There are now Oil Patch Chaplains in nine energy-producing states.

Because of your generous support, the IADC Houston Chapter was able to donate a total of \$55,000 to these organizations last year, bringing our total lifetime contributions to \$190,750. I hope you will join our efforts again, as we expect this year's event to build on our past success.

As we did last year, each team will be eligible to win one pistol per team (two pistols per team for Platinum sponsors) as door prizes. We believe it is important to give back to participants in addition to the charities.

I hope you will join our efforts again this year, and take pride in helping us support these two worthy organizations.
