Dockwise's Mighty Servant 1 set a new record in transporting the 32,767-ton semisubmersible Petrobras 36.

Dockwise sets record. Dockwise's heavy-transport vessel Mighty Servant 1 recently set a new record for tonnage shipped, the company reported. The ship delivered the 32,767-ton semisubmersible production unit Petrobras 36 from Sept-Isles, Canada, to Rio de Janeiro. To load the semi, the Mighty Servant 1 had to submerge to 25 m aft (12-m hull plus 13-m water above the deck).

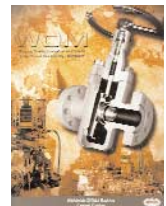

The 2-volume, 800-page data book (GRI-00/0002.1 and GRI-00/0002.2) features annual historical data for 1995-97 and a summary of the 2000 baseline projection at 5-year intervals from 1998-2015. Logging tool. Schlumberger's new High Resolution Laterolog Array (HRLA) tool is said to use new array focusing technology to provide 5 resistivity measurements to determine uninvaded formation resistivity.
