Agenda Item #1: Welcome, Introductions & Building Information

The IADC HSE Environmental Sub-Committee was called to order by Sub-Committee chairperson Jennifer May. Jennifer welcomed everyone and asked the attendees to introduce themselves. Joe Hurt, IADC gave the attendees with building and emergency response information.

Joe Hurt, IADC, reviewed the IADC Anti-trust Policy & Guidelines, calling attention to prohibited discussion topics. For a copy of the IADC Anti-trust Policy & Guidelines refer to http://iadc.org/antitrust/.

Agenda Item #2: Review of the Results from the 2010 EPAP Report

Joe Hurt, IADC VP Land Operations reviewed the 2009 and 2010 Environmental Policy Advisory Panel (EPAP) Survey data gathered from the participating companies. Joe also informed the group that due to restrictions on associations such as IADC cannot publish a report that would show individual company data information.

Agenda Item #3: Discussion of the IADC EPAP Reporting Guidelines compared to the OGP EPI and the API-OGP-IPIECA Greenhouse Gas Reporting

Joe Hurt provided a summary of the different industry reporting guidelines. Since the API-OGP-IPIECA emissions reporting guidelines are very similar and the OGP EPI has information on spills, while the API-OGP-IPIECA reporting does not, Joe spent time comparing IADC and OGP EPI guidelines.

The group decided to utilize the IADC EPAP guidelines for 2011 reporting. That would give the pilot three years of data to review.

Joe was tasked to review the EPAP guidelines and provide them to the sub-committee members by the end of the first week of January 2012. Anne Otten will distribute the revised guidelines and the reporting sheet amongst the participating companies.

Agenda Item #4: IADC Endorsement of IPIECA-OGP-API Sustainability Guidelines

After discussion about what "endorsing" meant and how it would affect each IADC member company, it was decided that the members will review the guidelines with the executives of each of their companies and provide IADC with their company's position on "endorsing" the guidelines by 9 February 2012. The group decided that the whole HSE Committee should be charged with voting on whether or not to endorse the IPIECA-OGP-API Sustainability Guidelines. The document can be found at:

Agenda Item #5: Regulatory Report – John Pertgen and Joe Hurt, IADC

John Pertgen, IADC, provided the Committee with information on two IADC-published semiannual reports:

- International Standards Activities affecting the Offshore Oil and Gas Industries Posted in April and October.
 - This report provides a handy reference to the standards development activities of various organizations (e.g., the International Maritime Organization, International Labor Organization, the International Organization for Standardization, and various international trade associations).
- Federal Regulatory Actions Impacting the Offshore Industry Posted in January and July

 This report provides a reference summary that reflects the regulatory actions, announced in the Federal Register by U.S. governmental agencies, which may affect operations in the oil and gas industries.

The most recent version of the Federal Regulatory Actions Impacting the Offshore Industry was posted on 6 July 2011. A few of the items highlighted by Mr. Pertgen are listed below (for a complete list, please see the full report at link above):

- Department of Homeland Security
 - The deadline for States to implement new minimum standards for Driver's Licenses and Identification Cards has been extended to 15 January 2013.
- US Coast Guard
 - o Lifesaving Equipment: Protection Testing and Harmonization with International Standards- the USCG issued a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking which proposes to amend its regulations for certain lifesaving equipment, including launching appliances, release mechanisms and survival craft, among others. This proposed rulemaking would also harmonize the Coast Guard's design, construction, and performance standards for lifesaving equipment with international standards.
 - Amendment to Marine Safety Manual, Volume III USCG issued a Notice of Proposed Policy Change with regard their cancelling the issuance of AB-MOU credentials. If the policy is cancelled, a mariner holding a credential endorsed as AB-MOU would, upon renewal, have the endorsement converted to AB-Limited, or, if the individual is so qualified, to AB-Any Waters, Unlimited.
 - Merchant Mariner Medical Advisory Committee (MMMAC) this is a newly formed committee which held its inaugural meeting in September 2011. The Committee's purpose is to advise the Secretary on matters related to medical certification determinations for issuance of merchant mariner credentials; medical standards and guidelines for the physical qualifications of operators of commercial vessels; medical examiner education; and medical research.
- Department of Interior / BOEM
 - Reorganization of Title 30: BOEMRE splits to become BOEM and BSEE the DOI issued a Direct Final Rule outlining the authorities of the two new agencies. More information can be found at: http://www.boemre.gov
