



HOW TO VOTE IN OKLAHOMA

1. **BE REGISTERED TO VOTE:** **Tuesday, October 14**, was the deadline.
2. **CONFIRM YOUR REGISTRATION:** Make sure you're registered to vote in this election. [CLICK HERE TO CHECK YOUR REGISTRATION STATUS](#)
3. **GET READY:** Catch up on the candidates and initiatives before you vote. [CLICK HERE AND ENTER AN ADDRESS FOR INFORMATION ON CANDIDATES RUNNING IN YOUR DISTRICT](#)

ELECTION DAY IN-PERSON VOTING:

- Polls are open from **7 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Tuesday, November 8.**
- You must bring a valid voter ID card or photo ID to vote in person. Here are the [forms of ID](#) that will be accepted.
- If you do not have or if you refuse to show proof of identity, you may vote by provisional ballot and prove your identity by signing a [sworn affidavit](#).

OTHER WAYS TO VOTE:

- **EARLY VOTING:** Begins **Wednesday, November 2**, and ends **Friday, November 4**. You can cast a ballot at any early-voting location in your county. Hours vary by location. Here is [more information](#) about early voting in Oklahoma. [CLICK HERE TO FIND YOUR EARLY-VOTING LOCATION](#)
- **VOTE BY MAIL (ABSENTEE):** Anyone in Oklahoma may vote by mail without justification. [Ballot-by-mail applications](#) must be received no later than **Friday, October 24**. Completed ballots-by-mail
