

HOW TO VOTE IN TEXAS

- 1. BE REGISTERED TO VOTE: Tuesday, October 11, was the deadline.
- 2. CONFIRM YOU'RE REGISTERED PROPERLY: CLICK HERE TO CHECK YOUR REGISTRATION STATUS
- 3. PREPARE: Educate yourself on the candidates and initiatives before you vote. CLICK HERE AND ENTER AN ADDRESS FOR INFORMATION ON CANDIDATES RUNNING IN YOUR DISTRICT

ELECTION DAY VOTING:

- Polls are open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Tuesday, November 8.
- You must bring a valid voter ID card or photo ID to vote in person.
 Here are the <u>forms of ID</u> that will be accepted.
- If you don't have a valid ID, you can still vote if you complete a Reasonable Impediment Declaration and show alternate ID, like a utility bill or bank statement.

OTHER WAYS TO VOTE:

- EARLY VOTING: Begins Monday, October 24, and ends Friday, November 4. You can cast a ballot at any early-voting location in your county. Hours vary by location. Here is more information about early voting in Texas. CLICK HERE TO FIND YOUR EARLY-VOTING LOCATION
- VOTE BY MAIL (ABSENTEE): <u>Click here</u> for eligibility requirements for voting by mail in Texas. Ballot-by-mail applications must be received no later than <u>Friday</u>, <u>October 28</u>. Completed ballots-by-mail
