



HOW TO VOTE IN TEXAS

1. **BE REGISTERED TO VOTE:** **Tuesday, October 11**, was the deadline.
2. **CONFIRM YOU'RE REGISTERED PROPERLY:** [CLICK HERE TO CHECK YOUR REGISTRATION STATUS](#)
3. **PREPARE:** Educate yourself on the candidates and initiatives before you vote. [CLICK HERE AND ENTER AN ADDRESS FOR INFORMATION ON CANDIDATES RUNNING IN YOUR DISTRICT](#)

ELECTION DAY VOTING:

- Polls are open from **7 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Tuesday, November 8.**
- You must bring a valid voter ID card or photo ID to vote in person. Here are the [forms of ID](#) that will be accepted.
- If you don't have a valid ID, you can still vote if you complete a [Reasonable Impediment Declaration](#) and show alternate ID, like a utility bill or bank statement.

OTHER WAYS TO VOTE:

- **EARLY VOTING:** Begins **Monday, October 24**, and ends **Friday, November 4**. You can cast a ballot at any early-voting location in your county. Hours vary by location. Here is [more information](#) about early voting in Texas. [CLICK HERE TO FIND YOUR EARLY-VOTING LOCATION](#)
